I want today to highlight some snippets from our Scriptures this final weekend before we embark on the Season of Lent. The Church has certainly chosen passages with power and challenge! The words from Leviticus ‘You must love your neighbour as yourself’ were so important to Jesus that he incorporated them into his Great Command of Love. Do you love yourself? Is that easy? Can you love your neighbour in that way? With Lent approaching, what are some practical ways of letting this quality of life/love be shared with others? Charity, kindness forgiveness, patience...?

‘...you belong to Christ and Christ belongs to God.’ St. Paul’s community in Corinth has been caught up in faction-fighting with slogans being used; the Apostle is so upset by this that he has to remind the people of the source of their faith and in whom they put their trust - Christ! The word ‘belonging’ might give the impression of ‘possession’ in a negative way. However, Paul is convinced that we have been chosen by the Lord and adopted as God’s children; hence we *belong* to God. Lent is very much a time of focusing on Baptism through which this amazing bond with Jesus Christ is sealed. In our parishes there are many preparing to join the Church in this way. Nevertheless Lent offers most of us the opportunity to reflect on the gift already received and to be renewed, strengthened and nurtured in the living out of this relationship.

Finally - and this is the most mind-blowing aspect of our Christian faith - ‘...love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you...’ (Matthew). *We* are to love our enemies wanting what is good for them; *we* are to pray for those who persecute us. We can’t just skate over these words! We must look to Jesus Christ himself to see these in action: he gives us an insight into how we can imitate God himself whose love has no bounds and who never holds back on pouring our generous love on creation. Who are the people in my life I need to consider? Who has hurt me? Who makes life a trial for me? Who do I find it impossible to forgive? God really does want us to be like him and never gives up on us! Might Lent 2020 be a turning point in our lives?

May these final days before Lent begins give you a chance to ponder big questions of the world and your life. Let each of us ask for the inspiration to choose a Lenten promise which will make us better people for the sake of our world. If you have time, read and re-read the profound words of today’s psalm in the light of your own life. God bless you. ***Fr. Norbert***

ASH WEDNESDAY is on 26th February and will mark our entry into the Season of Lent. Masses with the distribution of ashes will be at 9.30am at Holy Family, 12noon at St. Bonaventure's and 7pm at Our Lady's. Please remember Ash Wednesday is a Day of Fasting and Abstinence.

LENT During Lent there will be **Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament** for half an hour on a Monday after 9.30 Mass at Our Lady's (except 2nd March), on a Thursday after 9.30 Mass at Holy Family and on a Saturday after 10am Mass at St. Bonaventure's. There will be **Stations of the Cross** on a Wednesday after 9.30 Mass at Holy Family, on a Friday after 9.30 Mass at St. Bonaventure's and on a Friday after 7pm Mass at Our Lady's (except 13th March). The **Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession)** will be available on Thursdays at Holy Family Church 10.00 - 10.30am and on Saturdays - at St. Bonaventure's 10.30 - 11am and at Our Lady's 5.00 - 5.30pm. There will be priests also available at Our Lady's on Friday 20th March after Stations of the Cross and the Holy Week Service on Tuesday 7th April at 8pm at Our Lady's. Don't forget the **First Friday early morning Masses** at St. Bonaventure's at 6.30 followed by breakfast (6th March and 3rd April).

CARDINAL'S LENTEN APPEAL If you would like to support this charity Lent 2020, there are special envelopes available. The money raised will fund initiatives in Marriage and Family Life, Evangelisation through support given to young people in their faith and Service in Society especially in regard to those who have to make use of food banks because they cannot feed their children properly.

DEANERY GATHERING OF YOUNG PEOPLE will take place on Friday 13th March at Our Lady's. Young people from a number of Confirmation groups from parishes in the Stevenage Deanery will come with their catechists for 7pm which will be followed by the usual 'Restoration Holy Hour' which will end around 8.45pm. There will be refreshments at the back of the church to round off the evening. The event has been promoted by the Westminster Youth Ministry through its 'Summit' outreach programme and there will be some input from the WYM as well as from the group usually leading. There will still be Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, Scripture, prayer, music and silence ending with Benediction.

BIBLE STUDY UPDATE Fr Tony writes: 'On Thursday this week we held the third session of our bible study programme called. This session covered the 'Patriarchs' – Abraham, Isaac, Jacob and Joseph – who were the forefathers of Israel. An overriding theme was trust in God. For instance, we looked at the call of Abraham, which climaxed in God asking Abraham to trust him by offering up his son Isaac. Throughout the whole of the bible, God repeatedly asks the question, 'Do you trust in me?' We might ask ourselves: what does trust in God look like, as demonstrated by Abraham? And: how might God be calling us to trust in him today?

Bbcgoodfood.com has some great recipes. 2) Drive less and walk more. Try taking the bus or train for long distances, walk or cycle locally. Or if you must drive then try car sharing. 3) Buy second hand and repair. You can pick up great quality, unique items in the pentiful charity shops in the town. Or try the repair drop-ins in Hitchin to fix your item rather than throw it away. 4) Eat seasonally and locally. Eating within the seasonal rhythm of nature gives us better tasting food and cuts our carbon foot-print. 5) Go single use plastic-free. Buy a reusable coffee cup and water bottle to refill as you go and reduce the harmful plastic that ends up in our oceans.'
